

Intellectual Rights

We recommend that the data you provide comes with few or no use restrictions to maximize accessibility for future research. As such, it is encouraged that collaborators release their data under one of the two provided Creative Commons License options, CC0 or CC BY. CC0 is a declaration that you waive copyright claims to the data, that the data falls under the category of the public domain, and the data DOES NOT require users to use proper citations.

CC BY, on the other hand, requires users to provide appropriate credit for your work and indicate if they made any changes to your work. Both licenses allow for commercial use by users. If you decide to release your data under another license, you can input the description in the “Other” text field.
